About Salzburg

Salzburg is one of the most popular tourist destinations in Europe. Visitors come from all over the world to meander through the narrow streets and across the elegant squares of the old town, made a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997

Salzburg's layout and appearance are largely determined by the hills which surround its. On the Altstadt side of the river the Mönchsberg runs into the hill on which the fortress stands on (Festungsberg). Festungsberg and Mönchsberg encircle the old town, which ends at the River Salzach.

Today Salzburg has a population of over 140.000 inhabitants. One steady source of income is the Salzburger Festspiele (Salzburg Festival) taking place each summer. They were first staged in 1920, yet their origins go back to the middle of the 19th century. What started as a mystery play is now one of the most famous festivals in the world, with opera, theatre, orchestral concerts, Mozart matinees, serenades and much more. The Festspiele may be the social and cultural climax of the year, but this doesn't mean that the non-festival months in the calendar are devoid of culture. There are ca. 4.000 various arts events to suit all tastes on offer throughout the year. There are performances at the Salzburg's most-famous puppet theatre, concerts at Hohensalzburg Fortress, at the Residenz and in the marble ballroom at Schloss Mirabell.

Besides festivals, Salzburg is also a seat of learning. After years of discussion and argument - par for the course in Salzburg - on the location of the new university buildings, a solution worthy of Solomon was found; the sciences were given a prestigious new construction on the edge of the Freisaal meadows, one of the city's main parks, whilst the arts and law faculties settled in the palaces in the old town. This academic allocation was one of the reasons Salzburg's Altstadt was made a World Heritage Site. The Republic of Austria and the province of Salzburg spent around 100 million Euros historically restoring the palatial edifices and making the suitable for university

use. In doing so, they discovered a number of artistic details which had previously remained hidden, restoring them their former glory.

To Salzburg

By airplane

[Salzburg Airport](#)

is located in the south-west of the city. Low-fare airlines, which approach Salzburg include [Ryanair](#), [Hapag Lloyd Express](#) (HLX), [Air Berlin](#) and [Niki](#). To get to the centre of the city, you can either take a Taxi (5 km to the centre: approx. 8-15,- €) or the bus no. 2 (direction: "Hauptbahnhof").

If you fly to Munich, you can choose between a bus shuttle services (SMS Transfer Service) or train to come to Salzburg.

By rail

The main train station "Salzburg Hauptbahnhof" is approx. 3 hours away from Vienna and 1,5-2 hours away from Munich (Frankfurt/Main approx. 6 hours and Zurich 6-8 hours). The main train station is 15 minutes walking distance from the town centre. Austrian Railways provide a connections-query service online. Fast trains are ÖBB EuroCity (ÖBB EC), ÖBB InterCity (ÖBB IC), EuroCity (EC), InterCity (IC), InterCityExpress (ICE), EuroNightLine and CityNightLine. ÖBB EC and IC and most IC trains are equipped with electronic plugs. Slower trains are "Eilzug" (E) and "Regionalzug" (R)

By car

The motorways from Vienna and Linz (A1) and from Graz and Klagenfurt (A2 / A10) lead directly to Salzburg.

Drivers from member states of the European Union need a valid national driving licence - an international driving licence is not mandatory.

The maximum speed limits in Austria are - if not otherwise indicated on road signs - 130km/h on motor-ways and expressways, 100km/h on country roads and 50km/h in town between the local road signs.

Avoid drinking and driving in Austria: the permissible alcohol limit is 0.5 promille!

Wearing seatbelts is mandatory and since May 2005, it is required to carry a security vest in the car. It's not allowed to use your mobile in car without any hands free set.

Don't forget to apply a toll sticker (vignette) on the upper middle or left side of the windshield of your automobile, because they are compulsory for driving on motor-ways and expressways (even city motor-ways). You can purchase the toll sticker (e.g. a 10-days-sticker: 7,60 €) in Austria at the automobile clubs ÖAMTC or ARBÖ, at post offices, news agents and petrol stations or in neighbouring states at automobile clubs and at petrol stations close to the border.

In case of a breakdown you can contact one of the automobile clubs (ÖAMTC or ARBÖ) to engage the 24-hour emergency breakdown service (anyone can utilize it but non-members have to pay a fee). Call (+43) 120 for the ÖAMTC emergency breakdown service or (+43) 123 for the ARBÖ emergency breakdown service. Traffic news is broadcasted on the radio station Ö3
